Icom Australia Donates IC-41S to Wildlife Rescuers

In February 2009, Australia's worst bushfires brought on disaster not only to human beings, but also to wild animals. Icom Australia donated several IC-41S UHF CB radios¹ to the Wildlife Rescuers², a group of unpaid volunteers, to assist in helping animals in areas affected by the devastating Victoria fires. units. F50V sales are expected to grow even more rapidly in the coming months as initial test orders develop into large-scale purchases fueled by grant funding.

in Utah

Similar to other voice pagers commonly used by fire, EMS and SAR departments, the F50V offers 2-tone/5-tone and vibration alert. What sets the F50V apart is its full suite of radio features, including a

high channel capacity, clear audio, rugged MIL-STD construction, and submersible IP67 protection.

The F50V makes sense both functionally and economically, Smith says. The F50V merges the best of a pager and radio into one package, making it possible for departments to purchase one device and reap full functionality.

"We've generally found that for the same price as the Minitor V^{TM} , they get a 2-tone pager and a radio," Smith says.



Tight budgets often prevent smaller public safety departments from purchasing both a radio and pager for each responder. In the past, many departments chose to outfit responders with a pager – a dependable and low-cost option for notification and dispatch. A major disadvantage of using pagers, of course, is that personnel can not acknowledge the call or confirm response.

Smith says customers are pleased with the performance of the F50V. In particular, they mention its excellent reception, receive and transmit sensitivity, and waterproof construction.

"The radio sells itself," Smith says. "We're just opening our mouth and talking about it."
