

Eastman Theatre today. Because that pile of diplomas represents an investment of more than \$33 million dollars," from that greater community, Fisher said, reminding students to be supportive of education in the future.

English teacher Timothy Ackroyd affirmed the amount of time students have spent in school - more than six million minutes - to reach graduation. He also encouraged them to stay true to their character and work hard to achieve success.

"Quality of character is the only true road to success," Ackroyd said. He added that the class of 2002 has faced events which challenged the world, from the shootings at Colorado's Columbine High School in April 1999, to the recent terrorist attacks on America.

"You've seen things that no young adults should have to, yet you've endured, you've adapted, you are succeeding," he said.

Joshua Poole, class valedictorian, said the achievement of graduation has allowed him and his fellow students to learn, grow and become wiser from that which they have been dealt thus far in life.

"Whatever curve balls we were thrown in life," he said, "we were able to overcome them and move on."

High School Principal David Dimbleby and co-salutatorian Nicholas Earnhart reminded students of the importance of loved ones. Earnhart emphasized the role of family in a world that is full of modern conveniences.

"A healthy family life is essential for living life to its fullest, and leading a meaningful life is all anyone can ask for," he said.

Dimbleby identified five areas in life which must be continuously juggled: work, family, friends, health, and spirit. While work will bounce back if dropped, the other four are made of glass and easily broken, he said.

"Strive to balance the important things in your life," he said, "as you continuously juggle (the) competing interests and needs of each day."

Co-salutatorian Angela D'Orazio praised her fellow students, noting their good hearts and strong character.

"We've come a long way from being obnoxious freshmen to becoming strong, mature adults," D'Orazio said. "I know we're ready to make our mark on the world."
