

The QEC121, QEC122 and QEC123 are 880nm AlGaAs LED encapsulated in a clear purple tinted, plastic T-1 package.


Package Dimensions






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

Figure 3. Normalized Radiant Intensity vs. Forward Current 1000 I_F - FORWARD CURRENT (mA)





